From the CEO IT'S ALL ABOUT DOING YOUR BEST

Once every four years, just like the Olympics, Special Olympics athletes, families, and volunteers from around the world gather for the World Summer Games. In 2015, we all met in Los Angeles for one week of amazement.

There are a number of elements that make “our Olympics” special, but for me, the best thing about us is that there is no difference between Special Olympics at the world level and Special Olympics at the local level. This year’s living example of this is Benton County – Indiana’s own Amanda Cayton.

Amanda is like thousands of athletes in Indiana. She had some interest in Track and Field, but really didn’t enjoy running all that much. And then, something magical took place – she found the right sport and the right coach. Former Benton Central football coach Dave Black recognized her interest and agreed to become her coach. He knew the sport of Powerlifting, and dedicated his time to Amanda on the condition that she matched his level of commitment.

Spoiler alert... Two years later Amanda is a 4-time gold medal winner in Powerlifting at the 2015 Los Angeles Special Olympics World Games.

Just like almost every Special Olympics athlete I know, when a well-qualified coach makes a commitment and expects the best from his or her athletes, amazing things happen. Since July, many people have seen Amanda’s four gold medals and appreciated that she is the best in world. But if that’s all they think, they are missing the point. **Special Olympics is not about being the best – it’s about doing your best.**

It’s the same for Amanda as it is for each of the 11,000+ Special Olympics athletes in Indiana. Whether you volunteer, donate, coach, or cheer – you can be the person who helps a hidden champion realize their personal best.

WORLD-CLASS PROGRAMS

UNIFIED SPORTS®

Where individuals with and without disabilities train and compete on the same team against other Unified Sports® teams. Indiana has 3,273 partners.

CHAMPIONS TOGETHER

The establishment of the “Champions Together,” partnership between the Indiana High School Athletic Association (IHSAA) and Special Olympics Indiana begun when IHSAA Commissioner, Bobby Cox, challenged the IHSAA Student Advisory Committee (SAC) to engage in “servant leadership” and discover ways to give back to their schools and communities. The IHSAA SAC researched options, and unanimously requested that an official partnership be formed with Special Olympics as the most appropriate fit for education-based athlete servant leadership. Champions Together helps Special Olympics Indiana athletes to participate alongside their classmates in sports at their local high schools. The Champions Together program has grown from just 13 high schools since its inception, to more than 60 high schools today.

The partnership will provide a banner to all schools that meet minimum requirements in the areas of 1) student led servant leadership, 2) awareness and inclusion as it relates to all individuals with intellectual disabilities, 3) volunteerism through service to the schools and community and 4) fundraising to promote the vision and programs of Special Olympics Indiana.

ATHLETE LEADERSHIP PROGRAMS

Training is provided to athletes in a university setting so they can become public speakers, committee members, coaches, officials, and volunteers. In 2015, Indiana had 364 athletes enrolled in ALPs University, and 61 athletes have graduated.

YOUNG ATHLETES

Children ages 2-7 are introduced to Special Olympics through activities designed to foster physical, cognitive and social development. Indiana has 833 kids involved in Young Athletes since 2015.

HEALTHY ATHLETES

Five types of health screenings (sight, hearing, dental, padietry and fitness) are provided in order to improve athletes’ abilities to train and compete. Omit a total of 2,617 screenings were completed in 2015.



YEAR IN REVIEW

JANUARY

Lawrenceburg, Indiana hosted the Winter Games once again, as over 100 athletes took to the slopes to compete in skiing, snowshoeing and snowboarding.

MARCH

More than 2,400 athletes compete in the State Men's, Women's, and Youth Basketball tournaments including 5-on-5 full court, Unified Sports, 3-on-3, and more.

MAY

Each of Indiana's 10 Areas hosts Spring Games. These Games are among the most important of the over 2,800 competitions held in Indiana each year.

JULY

The Charity Golf Classic was held at Prairie View Golf Course, and raised over \$65,000. The event was made possible through our strategic partnerships with American Family Insurance, the Indianapolis Colts, and Enterprise Rent-A-Car.

SEPTEMBER

Eunice Kennedy Shriver (EKS) Games took place for three weekends at a variety of different venues in Indianapolis and surrounding areas. The EKS Games drew about 2,000 athletes competing in nine different sports.

NOVEMBER

The Indiana LETR program hosted the second annual Strikes for Special Olympics Indiana event where over 30 teams raised funds for Special Olympics Indiana and enjoyed some friendly competition.

FEBRUARY

Across the state of Indiana, more than 2,600 plungers were 'Freezin' for a Reason' at the 14 different plunge venues. The Polar Plunge generated more than \$600,000 to benefit Special Olympics Indiana.

APRIL

The Athlete Leadership Program (ALPs) trains athletes to serve in meaningful leadership roles in addition to that of competitor, by providing Special Olympics athletes a variety of choices in how they participate in the program.

JUNE

The first two weekends in June were busy for Special Olympics Indiana. During the weekend in June, the IHSAA hosted their annual Unified Track® and Field state competition that took place at Indiana University. The high school team that took home the State trophy was Lafayette Jefferson High School. Additionally, Special Olympics Indiana's State Summer Games took place on the campuses of Indiana State University and Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology. More than 2,6000 athletes competed in eight Olympic-type sports.

AUGUST

The 14th annual Plane Pull Challenge at the Indianapolis International Airport was a huge success with lots of participation from the community – with more than 2,000 people in attendance. Our friends and partners, from the Indiana Pacers showed up in a major way with presence from their High Octane Drumline, the Indiana Pacemates, Boomer, Freddy Fever, TV Host/Sideline Reporter Jeremiah Johnson and Pacers player Glenn Robinson III.

OCTOBER

The Colts Pavilion was the host site for the annual Breakfast with Champions Fundraising Breakfast. The event featured Special Olympics Indiana athletes, parents, board members and high school coaches. Each expressed their personal experiences and how Special Olympics has touched their spirits and transformed their lives. The event raised more than \$130,000.

DECEMBER

Athletes from all across Indiana participated in our State Bowling Tournament, our largest sport for Special Olympics Indiana. The first weekend in December athletes competed for medals at Western and Woodland Bowl in Indianapolis.

COMMITTED TO THE COMMUNITY

It takes a special person to decide to dedicate their life to helping others. Director of Special Education for the Mount Vernon and North Posey School Districts and 2015 Coach of the Year, Jacquelyn Maier, is a wonderful example of those rare few volunteers that believe impact is by doing.

Maier has served as a Special Education teacher for 22-years. For 20 of those years, she has coached both varsity cross country and track and field. For much of her career, Maier searched for a way to combine those two passions of Special Education and athletics. “I love athletics, and I truly believe in the value of the lessons learned from athletics,” Maier said. “The opportunity for our special education students in the district to be exposed to this level of sports competition, would be a beautiful experience for them.”

Jacquelyn made that dream a reality in 2013, when she began hosting Special Olympics Indiana competitions for her students and other athletes across Posey County –coaching track and field, basketball, and bowling. Immediately, she found a special bond coaching Special Olympics Indiana athletes. She felt the sports provided an opportunity to teach lessons that might be difficult to get across in a classroom setting.

“We are able to teach athletes about work ethic, responsibility and cooperation,” said Maier. “We teach them to set goals, so that they can see the value of perseverance and mental toughness as they work toward reaching those goals. In life, there are no short cuts, so when I am able to help athletes reflect on their experiences, we are helping them develop their confidence to break through boundaries, instead of setting limitations.” And while Maier takes on an exceptional amount of responsibility when putting on these athletic competitions, she is very adamant that she does not want all the credit and does not do this alone.

“I have an incredible support system from the community and the Posey County management team, and have been blessed, through in and throughout,” explained Maier. “I expected more resistance initially, because this is a big commitment, but quickly found that our attitude and passion for the athletes rubbed off on many people. It’s become a big deal in the community. We have a huge amount of amazing volunteers who have been there from day one. The athletes put their hearts and souls into Special Olympics Indiana, and so do we!”

The impact of volunteerism in Special Olympics for Jacquelyn has been life changing. Her children and husband have even experienced a transformation. “My whole family has been involved in this movement. It brings tears to my eyes when I think of how much my children have taken on this huge role and interacted with these athletes in a way I could not have even imagined. It’s honestly rewarding.” Jacquelyn has received a great deal of internal joy and excitement throughout these last few years. Every day I have participated in this movement, I am constantly reminded of the power the Special Olympics movement has in my life.



A FULL CIRCLE GIVE BACK

John Vanderbilt was a Special Olympics Indiana athlete for more than 30 years, training for and competing in many local and state events. To say Special Olympics changed his life is an understatement.

Not only did John feel this, but so did his sister Ruth – who made it her mission to sustain her brother’s memory and thank Special Olympics Indiana for helping to create positive and life-changing spaces for her brother and thousands of individuals with intellectual disabilities like him.

Ruth and her brother John were born and raised in a modest household in Terre Haute. Ruth was never able to afford a difference-making donation during her life; however, she did include Special Olympics Indiana in her will. Through a planned gift she memorialized her brother, and provided the resources needed to launch Indiana’s new Athlete Health and Fitness initiative.



Ruth reflected on life in her later years, and the many memories that included her brother’s love and passion for Special Olympics. According to her son David she said, **“I loved John dearly. He often would share how much he enjoyed his fellow Special Olympics athletes, who became like a second family. If those athletes were his family, then it is my responsibility to take care of my family – and give a gift that will make an imprint on the hearts, minds and spirits of other athletes and their families.”**

Ruth’s 2015 gift made her and her brother part of Special Olympics Indiana’s **Carl and Betty Erskine Society**. Their willingness to be listed as a member of the Society not only encourages others to follow their example, but inspires the family members, athletes and community at large that Special Olympics’ life-improving mission will continue for generations to come.
